Today, I'm going to talk about plastic. The history of plastic goes back to 1862. In England, Alexander Parkes made the first plastic. It was very *hard but could break or burn. After that, some types of plastics were made in America and France. People made clothes, clocks, toys, and parts of cars with plastic. There is a lot of plastic in the world today. Look around your home, school, and other buildings. We eat food with plastic forks and spoons. We drink water or tea from plastic cups with plastic straws. We sit on plastic chairs or benches. Every day, we use plastic pens and computers. Plastic is an important part of our lives.

Plastic is useful and necessary for us, but it is not always good for us. Have you ever thought about how much plastic we use every day? People around the world buy one million bottles every minute. Also, people use about nine hundred thousand plastic bags every minute. We use plastic bottles, cups, straws, and spoons but never use them again. Then, where does our plastic *garbage go? Plastic garbage goes from our houses, towns, and cities to rivers and the sea. Animals in the sea think this plastic garbage is food and eat it. I was shocked to know that one hundred million sea animals die from plastic *waste. Moreover, we eat some fish that eat plastic garbage from the sea. It means that we eat plastic inside ① them. It is not good for our health.

However, can you imagine life without plastic? We can buy food from different countries. Thanks to plastic *packaging, because food doesn't go bad and lasts, it can travel from country to country. We also use a lot of plastic in hospitals, too. Plastic tools are very clean and dry. This is very important for doctors and nurses. Do you know that plastic is sometimes ecofriendly? There is light plastic inside cars and buses. This light plastic saves energy because we don't have to use as much power with it as with other *metals when we drive them.

② All these examples show that plastic helps us have a good life.

After all, it is impossible to stop using plastic because it plays an important role in our lives. So, we need to think about what we can do with plastic. In some countries, such as Jamaica and Kenya, shops do not give new plastic bags to people. In other countries, such as New Zealand and Sweden, companies cannot make things with *microbeads. In Japan, people have to buy plastic bags in many stores.

More and more people try to recycle plastic every day. Some supermarkets have started collecting several kinds of plastic bags to recycle or reuse them. Recycling is good for the environment. You can make a lot of new things from old plastic. For example, you can

make a T-shirt with ten plastic bottles. You can make a sweater with sixty-three plastic bottles. And people have developed new machines to recycle a lot of different things.
